


### The 2020 Annual Meeting Moments

Cornelius Williams stresses that we cannot afford a "lost generation," as the protection of children during COVID-19 impacts the economic and social development of our society as a whole.





Laura and Judi pose the question to participants, "What are the key challenges you and your colleagues face to the protection of children during COVID-19?"

Participants' responses to key challenges included: Technology (63), child participation (45), sectoral silos (43), socio-economic challenges (45), mental health and psychosocial support (39), capacity building, risk assessment, collaboration, communication, access, recognition of CP as lifesaving/key workers, lack of government inclusion and buy-in. The top 5 challenges were discussed in depth on Day 3!





#### **Meaningful Child Engagement**

Engage children in decision-making and all aspects of the program cycle; Include <u>all</u> children, paying specific attention to marginalized groups; Involve children in preparedness, response and resilience strengthening; Use child-friendly communication tools.

#### **Capacity Strengthening**

Fund child-centred activities; Train social service workers, parents and caregivers; Understand risks from the child's perspective.

#### **Cross-Sectoral Collaboration**

Collaborate to access and listen to children; Enhance collaboration with other sectors to ensure holistic response to strengthen child wellbeing and protection.

#### Accountability

Strengthen advocacy efforts to prioritize child protection and wellbeing in IDOs; Advocate for social service workforce as essential workers and support them as they protect children.






Figure 6. Participant responses to ensuring no harm is done to children during IDO's




Figure 7. Participant responses to 'How are we held accountable for protecting children?'


